Opening Prayer:

Thomas the Apostle

St. Thomas was a dedicated but impulsive follower of Christ. When Jesus said He was returning to Judea to visit His sick friend Lazarus, Thomas immediately urged the other Apostles to accompany Him on the trip which involved certain danger and possible death because of the mounting hostility of the authorities.

At the Last Supper, when Christ told His disciples that He was going to prepare a place for them to which they also might come because they knew both the place and the way, Thomas pleaded that they did not understand and received the beautiful assurance that Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

Eight days later, on Christ's second apparition, Thomas was gently rebuked for his skepticism and furnished with the evidence he had demanded - seeing in Christ's hands the point of the nails. Thomas even put his fingers in the nail holes and his hand into Christ's side. After verifying the wounds were true, St. Thomas became convinced of the reality of the Resurrection and exclaimed, "My Lord and My God," thus making a

public Profession of Faith in the Divinity of Jesus.

Tradition says that, at the dispersal of the Apostles after Pentecost, Thomas evangelized Syria and Persia, then went on to Western India, and finally reached Southern India. One ancient text called "The Acts of Thomas" speaks of many conversions and miracles that Thomas performed. Around 68 to 72 AD, legend has it that, while praying on a hill in Chennai that is still called "Saint Thomas Mount", he was pierced in the back with a spear by order of the king for converting his wife and other family members to Christianity.

July 3 rd is the feast of Saint Thomas the Apostle and he is recognized as the patron saint of doubters, architects, blind people, builders, geometricians, masons, surveyors, and theologians.

Reflection:

Saint Thomas had his faults but Christ seems to understand this. He didn't forget about Thomas just because Thomas wasn't with the other disciples when he appeared to them earlier behind locked doors or because Thomas doubted him. On the contrary, Christ purposely sought him out and then greeted him with words of peace. Jesus didn't let him off the hook that easy and he will not allow us to withdraw from him so easily either. The Lord continues to this day, to seek out his own that have wandered away from him.

No doubt Thomas was absolutely astounded at the sheer reality of Jesus standing before him. He probably thought he was seeing a ghost until he touched Christ's hands and side. It might be the same with us one day too, when we finally get to meet Jesus in heaven. Will we be shy then? Jesus understands the beauty of our own faith and love for him and that it has been harder because we never knew him in the flesh like Saint Thomas did. Jesus said, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." He spoke of us long before we came into being.

- Both St. William's and St. Mary's campuses are in need of after care workers for the am and pm shifts
- Waukesha Public Schools notified WC that 2 of their bus routes were being canceled due to the lack of qualified drivers. 58 students are affected by this loss of transportation

Welcome

Elaine Steele welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 8:50 AM

Introductions/Attendance

Introductions were made and attendance taken. New APC representative from the Fond du

Lac/Sheboygan Deanery, Anthony Mischo, was welcomed.

Review of Minutes

Minutes from the March 18, 2023 meeting were approved.

Proposed Meeting Agenda

The agenda was approved as stated.

Presentation with Discussion & Questions:

Office of Catholic Social Responsibility – Susan McNeil, Director

- The CSR Office was formed from the Pastoral Priorities from the archbishop and the 2014 Synod; the office has broad reach to many people in need, taking Matthew 25 very seriously
- CSR Office intersects with community leaders and civic sects to help live out our Catholic faith and affirm the authentically Catholic faith expressions
- Synod priorities that formed the department include:
- 1. Bishops involved in social justice
- 2. Coordinated response to social issues
- 3. Hispanic ministry (the fastest growing community, especially youth, in the archdiocese)
- 4. Black Catholic ministry
- 5. Asian Pacific Islander communities
- 6. Ecumenical and inter-religious relations
- Accomplishments for the following areas were highlighted (see presentation for specific details of each area): Black Catholic Ministries, Asian Pacific Islander Ministry, Native American Ministry, Respect Life/Prison and Jail Ministry, Urban Ministry, Hispanic Ministry, Catholic Social Action, Ecumenical and Interfaith Concerns
- Accomplishments of the office include looking at the needs of communities not currently being met,

and serving our ethnic communities with, not only language translation, but by being culturally appropriate

Discussion and Questions from Presentation -

- Most important issues facing our parishes: affordable housing, gun violence, unifying human concerns committees across parishes before you can serve the community, working to connect across parishes within deaneries to share resources from each parish especially communication strategies across deaneries need to be developed
- Fr. Tim Kitzke as been appointed Vicar for Urban Ministry across ALL urban areas within the Archdiocese of Milwaukee
- Project Rachel, restarted within our archdiocese, was started by Vicki Thorn in Milwaukee
 Presentations and Remarks

ASIC Report - Susan McNeil

- The Office of Catholic Social Responsibility gave a presentation of its work at the last meeting which was the same presentation provided to APC (notes above)

Auxiliary Bishops – not present, no reports

Archbishop's Remarks - Most Reverend Jerome E. Listecki

- Eucharistic Revival -
- Archbishop had just returned from USCCB meetings in Orlando where the focus was on the Eucharistic Revival
- Milwaukee's Eucharistic Congress has about 700 people attending establishing the groundwork for the Revival with hope that consciousness if the Revival in parishes will rise
- four processions are being scheduled with one coming through Milwaukee starting June 22, 2024 to raise awareness of the Eucharist nation-wide
- Order of Catechists -
- meets 3 times per year, has 39 members in our archdiocese, we're ahead of other dioceses
- the order integrates mission into individuals' ministries and was established 4 years ago; catechists can become ministry leaders where there are not a lot of priests (such as the Hmong

community) with significant impact

- catechists incorporate evangelization and stewardship into teaching and individuals' faith
 development
- the vision is to form a network in the arch to spread and transcend/connect individuals and good practices
- membership is by invitation based on reputation/witness of faith, members are chosen to lay a foundation of demonstrating faith and commitment
- Archbishop Listecki suggested it to USCCB six years ago, our arch can be a sounding board for other dioceses
- Archbishop is Chairman of the Committee on Canonical Affairs and Church Governance he spoke about the new petition for canonization for the martyrs of Shreveport, a reminder to us of how we serve during challenging times

Discussion and Questions for the Archbishop from Deanery Reports -

Dodge/Washington -

- If you haven't encountered Jesus yet, what good is the Eucharist?
- Because of the fact that it is the real presence of Jesus, each species stands by itself as Christ

Fond du Lac/Sheboygan -

- Understanding that the Archbishop cannot say a Mass at each of the 189 parishes in the archdiocese within a year, would it be possible for him to preside at a Mass at one parish in each Deanery? Can Archbishop

Listecki do some type of farewell tour before he retires?

Archbishop did go to each deanery when he first arrived, activities are being planned for his retirement and he is looking at doing something like this

Kenosha -

- Is there training/mentoring for new priests assigned to churches?
- There is not only a continuing education program for new priests, but also training offered to experienced priests

Milwaukee Northwest -

- What is the follow-up on safety questions from the past?

Parishes can establish safety committees as needed, engage with local police departments, request safety reviews with Bruce Varick, Laura announced a free safety event/presentation at WCTC in late August (she will forward the flyer)

Milwaukee Southeast -

- Three parishes have moved the tabernacle off to the side and no longer front and center behind the altar.

Why are parishes moving the tabernacle?

The request to move a tabernacle goes through scrutiny and approval from the archbishop, the request could be based on structural issues but always is scrutinized by the arch

- Regarding the LOA campaign: How many donors are there and what is the average participation rate at a parish (the LOA consultant said that about 13% of parishioners tend to donate)? If we look at the percentage of parishioners giving to the campaign, what does our success rate look like? Is the perception of "fewer people giving more" a healthy place to be with our Archdiocese? Is that perception accurate?

 Participation is usually 22-23%, a normal range among fundraising initiatives, but we've seen as high as 44%, 92% of goal so far, we still have Wave 4 and 5 to contribute toward the goal, no tracking yet on dollars collected since the pledge is over 5 years' time, some funds are already being dispersed, we are in a healthy place since we are meeting goal we need to let people buy in and be counted as supporting their parish, all donations are accepted no matter how small
- There is a lot of tracking when it comes to money. We need organized prayer for healing and to demonstrate that we are doing more than just raising money as a part of LOA. Do we keep track of prayer as diligently as we do money?

We don't see evangelization initiatives on reports from parishes, only financial reports, but parishes need to show how membership is growing focusing on moving from maintenance to mission, inviting people into our parishes

Ozaukee/Milwaukee Northeast -

- Why are the APC meeting minutes not sent out to the deaneries?

Meeting minutes can be sent out to deanery members once they are approved by APC members

- There are school families that have concerns about standards-based grading and are aware that it is policy to teach with standards in mind, but do not have a sense of what a 1, 2, 3 versus a letter grade is on the report cards. Is this standards-based grading and edict from the archdiocese?

Please contact your local school office

- With the apostolic mission piece (the book: From Christendom to Apostolic Mission: Pastoral Strategies for an Apostolic Age), would it be helpful for parishes to have an audit of programs?

 We need to first capture an apostolic perspective and incorporate an understanding of evangelization in all we do, then look at your ministries and programs with that mindset

 Walworth —
- How can we best manage people coming to funeral Masses who don't know responses and when to kneel, stand, etc.?

It's up to individual parishes and presiders, the celebrant can say, "Please stand," etc., it can be a chance to evangelize

Waukesha East -

- Regarding the Day of Reconciliation, can a general absolution during a liturgy be done?

 A general absolution is not permitted as it is not valid except in the case of an emergency like a plane crash, there is a perception that a communal penance service can do that but it can't, Reconciliation is personal ownership of your sinfulness and being able to receive absolution
- How is the aging population being addressed, and why are kids leaving the church (20-30 year olds who don't feel they belong)?

The church is not Ben & Jerry's (ice cream), ou actually come to church to look to our savior, it's a different perspective that society no longer sins (not needing to come to church), but it has to come from parents and family demonstrating their faith - examples to envision later in life and transmitting values

- Why don't Pastors have some decision-making power in the selection of Associate Pastors?

They do, they have input with interviews of associate pastors, we don't have a "bench" of priests to

assign but we're better off than other dioceses, sometimes priests are reassigned based on need but the norm for associate pastors is a three-year term

- Why can't we have women Deacons?

The early church did have women, but ordination for priests and deacons is tied to persona

Christi (in the person of Christ)

Waukesha West -

- What is the plan for the archdiocese to address how we attract the young generation (the family unit and children)?

The hope is with younger priests, especially those from our area. They are attracting and making connections with young families

- St. Mary of the Hill is celebrating its 99th Anniversary
- St. Boniface Human Concerns committee active with their food pantry and supporting Ghana
- Immaculate Conception has a formation program for cognitive impaired persons

- the first hybrid Zoom/in-person deanery meeting was very successful
- Anthony Mischo became the new APC rep from the deanery
- the purposes of APC and Deanery meetings was discussed with amazing realization of purpose

Milwaukee Southeast -

- discussed the bombarding of multiple campaigns and aggressive marketing (LOA, CSA, Catholic Charities), would like to know where the money is going
- Divine Mercy celebrating 20 years since merger
- looking to increase devotions and adoration times

Milwaukee Southwest -

- focus on evangelization to Hispanics with a booth at West Allis a la carte event with Mary Queen of Saints Catholic Academy
- Restore Truth seminar series held at St. John the Evangelist
- requesting resource materials or tip sheets on evangelizing to youth and stats on what the Catholic church is doing
- Eva Diaz (arch staff) gave a fantastic presentation at the Deanery meeting

Ozaukee/Milwaukee Northeast -

- Gesu is applying to become a Basilica
